Tampa Women's Club Fashion For Charity






The Tampa Palms Women's Club Fashion Show has been an annual Tampa Palms event for decades.

Each year the TPWC presents the Fashion Show as a fundraiser to support praiseworthy organizations that focus on the needs of the most worthy in our community - the children.




Kids and Canines - Working with at-risk teens, teaching them how to train assistance dogs for individuals with disabilities

PUT THEM AWAY

Garbage and recycle collection has improved substantially in Tampa Palms.

The Good News

The new garbage and recycle containers have virtually cured any problem with unprotected garbage bags left for collection and opened by wild animals who spread the contents on the streets.



The Bad News

Unfortunately, there are some residents negligent in putting the garbage and recycle containers away on the evening of collection.

The TPOA receives more complaints about garbage containers left street-side after collections - sometimes for days -than any other standards failure.

Garbage and recycle containers should be removed from the street as promptly as possible—in no event left overnight.



ARTICLE XII SECTION 8. Clotheslines, Garbage Cans, Tanks, Etc. All clotheslines, garbage cans, above-ground tanks, and other similar items shall be located or screened so as to be concealed from view of neighboring Units, streets, and property located adjacent to the Unit.

The TPOA has no choice: citations are on the way to non-compliant residents.

Upscale neighborhoods do not display garbage or garbage containers along the streets after collection day.

A NOTE ABOUT TPOA LIENS

The TPOA frequently get inquires from surprised and maybe even shocked owners about a lien placed on their property.

A lien is a form of security interest granted over an item of property to secure the payment of a debt or performance of some other obligation. They are a matter of public record.

Though any owner subject to a TPOA lien was repeatedly warned before the lien action was taken, some simply throw the legal notifications away say "who cares"..... until they care.

Owners have advised the TPOA that they have found:

- Many credit card companies have the agreements that allow them to limit credit or increase interest rates when there is evidence of liens.
- Many organization will refuse to extend credit if the owners' property is subject to a liens.
- Renegotiation of mortgages or the acquisition of new mortgages is detrimentally affected.

The TPOA only places liens on owner property most reluctantly and only when there is no alterative:

- Unpaid owner dues.
- Uncorrected standards failures and/or unpaid fines for failures.

If you have unpaid assessments or have been notified about standards failures, call the TPOA and review the situation. **Don't just burn money on legal fees or other costs.**

Compton Park Playground Closed

Work on the new meeting facility at Compton Park has gotten underway in earnest.

As of March 20th chain link fencing is in place to protect the construction area. Notwithstanding the security provided by the fence, the TPOA Board has determined that having children in such close proximity to construction is not a good idea.

The playground facilities have been closed until completion of the construction. In the coming weeks the existing play equipment will be disassembled and removed.

When the construction is complete, a new and improved playground will be installed.



Until that time there are three other Tampa Palms parks available to meet residents' recreation needs:

River Park - Tampa Palms own "mini state park" with Hillsborough River access, pavilion and restroom facilities and miles of trails to enjoy.



- Hampton Park Athletic events of tennis and racquetball, along with a pavilion and playground facilities.
- Amberly Park -Quiet repose of paths and benches to view the lake and fountain with a pavilion and playground facilities.







Moving To Complete The Compton Park Renewal

The Compton Park clubhouse has served Tampa Palms



well. Built in the late 1980's it received a facelift in the late 90's to reconfigure and better utilize the limited space available.

The adopted plan for Compton Park includes construction of a second building on the Compton site, attached to the main clubhouse by a covered walkway. This building will accommodate additional activities but minimize the requirements for additional staff.



Upon completion of the second building, renovations to the existing clubhouse would commence thereby converting the existing clubhouse into a more usable and community-friendly space.



Plans for that renovation are underway and will be presented to the community at the Sept Business Meeting - just ahead of the opening of the new building.

What To Do With The Fitness Room?

The original building will continue to house the offices for the TPOA, along with file storage, increased restroom facilities [for both the building and pool], an improved kitchen lavout and a fitness center.



The TPOA is currently designing the layout and evaluating equipment for the refurbished fitness room.

Parents interested in volunteering on testing dates must first confirm that the teacher they are volunteering for isn't testing that day. and arrive in the classroom by 8:00 am and stay in the classroom until testing is over or arrive at school when testing is over around 11:30 am.

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Beware of the Alligators

Because of its unique location, Tampa Palms is home to literally thousands of alligators. They inhabit the 80 storm water ponds, the wet-lands and, of course, the Hillsborough River.

There are a few common sense rules for keeping your children, pets and yourself safe from these intriguing but dangerous neighbors:

- 1. Leave alligators alone. Provoked, with a stick or even noise, they become much more dangerous.
- 2. NEVER feed, or allow others to feed an alligator. They lose their fear of humans and begin to view humans as a food source.
- 3. Make certain that small children do not play or even approach a pond or river bank or a wetland boundary.



- 4. Keep pets away from ponds and wetlands. An alligator can strike to grab a dog— even one on a leash—in seconds with tragic consequences for the pet and the owner.
- 5. Remember that alligators are most active from dusk to dawn so be wary of ponds at night.
- 6. If you are cut or bitten by an alligator— even a very small one— seek medical attention. Alligators carry numerous bacteria dangerous to humans.

Large alligators, in particular those which have been fed by humans, are extremely dangerous. This one was taken from the Asbury pond a few years ago and weighed more than 300 lbs.



Fla Fish & Game will have trappers remove nuisance (large or aggressive) alligators.

Take Stock—What Needs To Be Done


1. <u>Has mud or mildew collected in</u> places on your home or roof?

Many times a little spot cleaning will make all the difference in a home's appearance.



2. <u>Is your mailbox saying unfortunate</u> things about your home?

It's unlikely your mailbox looks like this one but rust, mildew, fading paint on the post or a leaning post all make a home look unkempt





3. Check your shrub beds.

Are the bed lines even? Do plants need a spring trimming and grooming?

Are shrubs or other required screens properly hiding your utility boxes or air conditioning units from view from the street or neighbors?



The personal pride of ownership, the need to sustain the value of what is often the primary owner asset, as well as, the requirements of the Tampa Palms governing documents all demand that all homes be well kept-up.

New Tampa Rotary

Regular weekly club breakfast meetings are held on Friday mornings at 7:00 AM in the Banquet Hall at the Tampa Palms Golf and Country Club, 5811 Tampa Palms Blvd.

The Rotary Club of New Tampa participated in a Service Project with Meals of Hope on Saturday March 22 in the cafeteria of Freedom High School.



The event was called Rotary Feeds America – the goal was to assemble 25,000 fortified meal packets in 2 hours. Each meal feeds 4-6 people. 700,000 people in west central Florida struggle with hunger (250,000 of them are children.)



The meals were passed on to local Feeding America group.

Rotary will create 100,000 meals in Tampa with this project.



The food products were provided by Meals of Hope and the meals were distributed by Feeding America Tampa Bay.


You can set your table up between 7 a.m. - 8:00 a.m.
