
## Where Is Tampa Palms?

Several times a week the TPOA or the CDD receive calls questioning what is included in Tampa Palms and what is not included.

There is a great deal of confusion as to what is *Tampa Palms*, stemming in part from the fact that the original developers of Tampa Palms had a vision of extending Tampa Palms all the way north to New Tampa Blvd. (West Meadows was originally Tampa Palms Area 7, Richmond Place, Tampa Palms Area 6.)

That vision was never realized and all areas except original Tampa Palms were sold to others prior to being developed.

The aerial map shown below outlines Tampa Palms, as well as, the neighboring communities.



## Are Tampa Palms Facilities Open To The Public?

There are numerous amenities in Tampa Palms: they are not generally open to the public.

These amenities were built either with developer funds (the cost of which was passed along to Tampa Palms owners in the sale price of their homes) or bond funds, which were paid for by the Tampa Palms owners until the bond debt was paid in 2007.

These amenities are all maintained through assessments paid solely by the Tampa Palms property owners.

The parks owned by the CDD (a unit of State government) allow public use, subject to a fee that equates to what Tampa Palms owners pay to maintain the parks.

## Near-By Communities

Tampa Palms North, outlined in orange on the map to the right, is a HOA developed by Lennar and others. The original signs at the entrances to TP North continue to say “Tampa Palms” adding to the confusion.

TP North is home to the beautiful Club Tampa Palms, which is an amenity not open to Tampa Palms owners.

Tampa Palms 3, aka TPOST Areas 3, is outlined in blue on the map to the right. It is home to the mini-regional mall and includes many commercial and multi-family areas that are not yet developed.

TPOST 3 is part of the CDD that serves West Meadows & Richmond Place.

## Time To Reset Irrigation Timers

### Daylight Savings Time Is Here

Tampa Palms residents and property owners are reminded to check their timer settings on irrigation systems due to the time change to Daylight Saving Time on Mar 11th.

This is also a good opportunity to make certain that irrigation is set for the proper assigned days and times.

The following year-round twice-a-week irrigation schedule is currently in effect for locations in Tampa Palms:

- All addresses ending in 0, 1, 2, or 3 - Mon and Thurs;
- At addresses ending in 4, 5, or 6 - Tues and Fri;
- At addresses ending in 7, 8, or 9 - Wed and Sat

Residents with new plantings may phase in their landscape with additional watering days. For the first 30 days, daily watering is allowed. For the next 30 days three days a week is permitted. Low volume irrigation of shrubs and annuals is not subject to these restrictions.

Non-potable watering sources are also not subject to these restrictions. The CDD and TPOA irrigate under a volume-based SWFWMD permit. The CDD also uses low volume irrigation methods for about 35% of its irrigation needs.

### SWFWMD Phase I Watering Restrictions Remain In Effect

SWFWMD left the Phase I watering restrictions in place for residents of Hillsborough County, while tightening restrictions for some other counties.



SWFWMD took this action in part because rainfall for 2012 has been slightly below historic averages and total rainfall for all 2011 was also below historic averages. Traditionally this time of year Tampa Palms has reduced rainfall.

The lack of meaningful rainfall can be seen in the pond levels along the boulevard. They are 3-4 feet below their normal levels.

## The Time For The Garden Is Here



### Going “Green” Out of Doors

Spring is here and it is time to spruce up Tampa Palms. A little attention will save the embarrassment (and cost) of deed restriction violation processes.

Take a few minutes to:

Check your roof, home and mail-box for accumulated dirt or mildew and spot clean if needed.

Clean up your yard. Rake leaves, clean out and edge beds

Repair or replace landscape that has been bitten by the cold winter. Remember removing dead items, trimming and shaping shrubs often does wonders for the look of your home without HUGE expense



New landscaping laws and the growing homeowner demand for low-impact and low-maintenance yards are changing the way Tampa Palms owners are freshening their yards this year.



There are some tools available to assist the homeowner in planning landscape upgrades and saving those precious resources in short supply – money and water.

2. SWFWMD has prepared an excellent primer on replacing sod. ## Tampa Palms Elementary Time To Shine

Per principal Ms. Keenan, TPE looks at standardized testing as **a time to shine**. So that each child is ready to “strut their stuff” she recommends:

- 1. Get a good night's sleep** before the test. Staying up late at night studying/reviewing only increases anxiety, which interferes with clear thinking.
- 2. Eat for Success.** A hearty breakfast with seven to ten grams of fiber will keep your child from getting jittery from a sugar high or, later, bottoming out when his/her insulin goes up.
- 3. Relax.** If a child is too nervous, he/she may forget what they know. Your child can stretch and breathe deeply to help focus his/ her mind.
- 4. Wear comfortable clothes.** Pants shouldn't be so tight they keep your child from breathing fully. Working brains needs oxygen.
- 5. Drink plenty of water.** This is another way to keep your child alert.

**Don't forget to give your child a big hug on test days.** This will increase your child's sense of well-being and energy.

Ms. Keenan hopes that parents find these tips helpful. If any parent has questions or concerns about testing, Ms. Keenan says to please feel free to contact your child's teacher, Ms. Lippek, or Ms. Keenan.

Tampa Palms Elementary is very proud of its outstanding representatives to the District Science Fair in February at the Tampa Convention Center.





## Tampa Summer-Time Fertilizer Ban

The City of Tampa ban on the use of certain fertilizers became effective last year and goes into effect June 1, 2012.

The basic requirements are:

- Fertilizer containing nitrogen and/or phosphorous cannot be applied to turf during the restricted season from June 1 through September 30.
- Granular fertilizer containing nitrogen, must contain no less than 50% slow release nitrogen.
- Fertilizer containing phosphorous cannot be applied to turf or plants unless a soil analysis test indicates phosphorous deficiency.



The graphic to the left is a basic explanation of what the content numbers on a typical bag of fertilizer mean.
